I Corinthians 2:9, "But as it is written, Eye hath not seen, nor ear heard, neither have entered into the heart of man, the things which God hath prepared for them that love him."

On several occasions, there are companion scriptures in the Old Testament writings which coincide with a major emphasis in the New Testament. The prophet Isaiah, by the revelation of the Spirit, was shown not only Christ, but also the wonderful blessings in store for God's people in the gospel age and in Heaven/Paradise.
