Character: We All Have One; good or bad.

A man's (or woman's) character is that which identifies us as who we are: the way we think, the decisions we make, a believer or non-believer in Christ, honest or dishonest, and on and on. Wherefore I was grieved with that generation, and said, They do alway err in their heart; and they have not known my ways. So I sware in my wrath, They shall not enter into my rest.)**

As professed believers in Christ, our character should be one of the hight level. Honest, Trustful, Kindhearted, Loyal, Holy, Patient, Loving, Caring, A God Fearing Believer, are all good traits which should help to make one of good character. Joshua and Caleb had two such characters. They came back with a truthful report - one filled from a positive aspect.

Consider the character of Christ. His humanity was just as true to the aspects of a good character as was His deity. He kept the Law to a jot and to a tittle, never wavering. The Bible is written concerning the actions of the Israelites over a number of years. One of the traits attributed to them was one of being "back sliders" - Not a good trait to have as a part of our character. The three Hebrew children showed forth their good character with the aid of the Holy Spirit in how they withstood Nebuchadnezzar, even after being cast into a burning fiery furnace.

Briefly, how do we maintain a good character before God? Matthew 11:28-30 explains this very thing. Jesus said, **"Come unto me, all ye that labour and are**

heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light."
