Proverbs 1:10, "My son, if sinners entice thee, consent thou not."

Temptation! This world is full of things to tempt the children of God. Satan is still going about seeking whom he may devour. Temptation is on every hand. So much so, that marriages are ending because of the temptation these devices provided and the lack of constraint by so many.

Solomon, in Proverbs 1:10, is not talking directly to his own son, but to all those of his posterity; all those that would follow him for years to come.
