Romans 15:5-6, "Now the God of patience and consolation grant you to be likeminded one toward another according to Christ Jesus: That ye may with one mind and one mouth glorify God, even the Father of our lord Jesus Christ."

Notice how the people responded in Acts 8:6 to the words of Philip, "And the people with one accord gave heed unto those things which Philip spake, hearing and seeing the miracles which he did." God has surely performed many miracles for the benefit of His people and we should all be "likeminded" in recognizing what He has done for us and in our pursuit of doing His will. When you go to church next Sunday, would it not be good if we strived to be of "one mind" and that it be that our minds were centered on Christ and His righteousness? Think about it!
