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Promise Land Prophecy:

Did God's Promise Fail?

We are living in a day when those who deny the fulfillment of biblical prophecy are growing even more bolder. Premillennialist hold on to the idea of a so-called coming millennium. They use Genesis 15:18 as proof that the biblical prophecy was never fulfilled as God promised. To find the answer we again must go to the book of truth in I Kings 4:21, "And Solomon reigned over all kingdoms from the river unto the land of the Philistines, and unto the border of Egypt: they brought presents, and served Solomon all the days of his life." The presents presented to Solomon from all these lands under his reign, where known as tribute. Tribute was a payment made of those who considered themselves servants to Solomon and understood his authority over them.

Today, there are many who have fallen into the same trap of believing that Christ (God) could fail, period! Even some ordained Christian ministers are preaching that Jesus failed and must be helped in order to save His people from

eternal torment. There is nothing worse than advocating a weak Christ, that needs the help of man to save His people eternally. Let us today, give God the glory He deserves by declaring the love and power of Christ. God's boundaries have never changed and will not change. The boundaries of His people are declared in John 6:39, "And this is the Father's will which hath sent me, that of all which he hath given me I should lose nothing, but should raise it up again at the last day."

Just as it was sure and stedfast that God's promise to Abram would be fulfilled, Christ will fulfill the covenant between Him and God in John 6:40 when Jesus declared, "...I will raise him up at the last day."

As the day proclaimed as Easter approaches, many will worship the Lord and hopefully remember the death, burial, and resurrection of our Lord, Jesus Christ. We have His promise that He is coming back to receive us unto Himself in like manner as He was raised from the grave. Till that day occurs, may we remain faithful believers of His promises.
