How fearful Joseph (Matthew 1:19-20) and Mary must have been when the angel Gabriel appeared unto each of them with news they neither expected. When the angel came to Mary (Luke 1:29) it says "she was troubled at his saying, and cast in her mind what manner of salutation this should be."
