Conditional Salvation

And she shall bring forth a son, and thou shalt call his name JESUS: for he shall save his people from their sins. Matt 1:21

I am amazed that people do not believe Jesus can actually save His people and attack this truth with vitriol hatred.

Unskilled zealots in the word of God who do not have the slightest idea of what it means to rightly divide the word of truth only see eternal salvation EVERYTIME they see the words "saved, or salvation" in the scripture. They will never find any consistency in handling the word of God.

Text that clearly are conditional and speak of the state of the individual here in time cannot be overlooked. If they are applied to eternal salvation they miss the mark. These are the text that speak of chastisement for disobedience and the withholding of blessings. There application is only to the here and now, not to eternity.

If you believe that you can lose eternal salvation, I fear you may have had the wool pulled over your eyes. Jesus did not come to earth to give His life for His people and then fail to actually save his people.

Again, those text that speak of one falling from grace or losing salvation always result from a persons unwillingness to walk in obedience and perform good works. Therefore it can not be eternal salvation under consideration, because we know that is accomplished by the grace of God apart from any works by the individual.

If you attaching conditions to eternal salvation, you err greatly if you claim salvation by grace. Jesus trod the winepress alone and finished the work God gave Him to do.

As thou hast given him power over all flesh, that he should give eternal life to as many as thou hast given him. And this is life eternal, that they might know thee the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom thou hast sent. I have glorified thee on the earth: I have finished the work which thou gavest me to do. John 17:2-4
