Jesus or John Darby?

1 Cor 15:22-27 For as in Adam all die, even so in Christ shall all be made alive. But every man in his own order: Christ the firstfruits; afterward they that are Christ's at his coming. Then cometh the end, when he shall have delivered up the kingdom to God, even the Father; when he shall have put down all rule and all authority and power. For he must reign, till he hath put all enemies under his feet. The last enemy that shall be destroyed is death. For he hath put all things under his feet. But when he saith, all things are put under him, it is manifest that he is excepted, which did put all things under him. And when all things shall be subdued unto him, then shall the Son also himself be subject unto him that put all things under him, that God may be all in all.

When Christ comes back at the resurrection it will be the end of time, our text tells us plainly. Our text also tells us plainly that at this time, the kingdom is not coming down to be established so the Christ can rule and reign. Oh no. At the end, Jesus will have delivered UP the kingdom to God. BEFORE this time, He is ruling and reigning. (Again I state He is ruling and reigning in the hearts of His people. Remember the kingdom of God is withing you.)

If the kingdom goes back up at the resurrection at the end, that means it has been here all along. It also means that Jesus has been reigning in His kingdom this whole time. You see, at the end, Jesus does not begin to reign as some expect that He will. On the contrary, he lays down all rule authority and power, and subjects Himself to God The Father that God may be all in all.

Our friends living in John Darby's world of imagination are expecting exactly the opposite of what the scripture teaches. The apostle John saw the kingdom coming down, and Paul states the exact event when it goes back up. Down and Up. It does not get any easier than this friends.

If you buy into the pre-millennial kingdom theory, expecting that Christ is not yet reigning, you may just miss out on the righteousness, peace and joy that you can have, NOW, today! Today is the day of salvation.

Luke 11:20 But if I with the finger of God cast out devils, no doubt the kingdom of God is come upon you.

Jesus says there is no doubt that the kingdom has come unto us. Who you going to believe? Jesus or John Darby?
