Rewards

And if by grace, then [is it] no more of works: otherwise grace is no more grace. But if [it be] of works, then is it no more grace: otherwise work is no more work. [Rom 11:6 KJV]

The idea that one can work and receive a greater reward in heaven than someone else is totally contrary to the doctrine of grace. In fact it circumvents the works of the cross if you think about it.

Immortal glory is an inheritance that was secured totally by Jesus and is given to God's elect who are adopted into the family of God.

Now a reward is payment for a work or service rendered. We do not get into heaven this way, nor do we merit a greater status than anyone else.

That is what happens **HERE ON EARTH** in the kingdom of heaven, the church. We are judged daily and rewarded for our works in the here and now.

If you will just give this a try it will amaze you.

All those works / rewards texts you have been trying to figure out, but cant with any consistency, **STOP** trying to make an eternal application and see if a timely application works.

You are pointing your gospel gun in the wrong direction when it comes to works /rewards. For men, they belong strictly here in time.

There is no other way to be consistent with the doctrine of salvation by grace alone.
