- \* While the compiler of this table agrees *Yěhowshuwa`* (that is, *Joshua*, meaning "Jehovah is salvation) is the Branch's Hebrew name, not the cryptic acrostic mocking John 3.16 used by the Jews *Yeshu* or *Jesu*, he does not believe in the recent wake of Messianic Judaism (a lot that does not generally embrace Jesus, but does embrace the messianic concept), also called the Hebrew Roots or Sacred Names Movement it is less proper to call Jesus by this English name dating before the twelfth century to the time of the Anglo Saxon Gospels. *Jesus* is a direct translation of His Greek name Strong's G2424 Ἰησοῦς *lēsous* from the Hebrew H3091 יְהוֹשֻׁעַ, from which over twenty languages derive their translation of Jesus name. I post this in the hope Khazarian, Reform, Orthodox, Torah (those closest to the Israelites or Hebrews of the Old Testament), Hasidic and other types of Jews may see the **definitive evidence that all 351 of these prophecies are wholly satisfied in spite of the prodigious prospect against them, unlike the traditions of the elders (Talmud, Zohar, Kabbalah). Alleluia!** This prospect is for just 48 prophecies one in 10<sup>157</sup> (McDowell, Josh. *Evidence That Demands a Verdict: Historical Evidences for the Christian Faith*. San Bernardino, CA: Here's Life Publishers, 1989, Vol. I, pg. 187), or 10 followed by 157 zeroes, 1e+157; beware MacDowell's New Evangelicalism. Moreover, scorners such as secularists as well as

professing Christians can learn to indeed trust the word of God as far as it derived from the Second Rabbinic Bible and Byzantine texts, such as the Authorized King James Version available at [tbsbibles.org](http://tbsbibles.org), as well as for free as in PDF format on our blog with our creeds. Not only has God preserved His Book down to the minutest Hebrew letter, the jot seen above, but God also is the Omnipotent and reigns! This also proves the validity of the Authorized Version and the corruption of unauthorized, Gnostic, modernist versions (NAS, NIV, ESV, New ASV, New KJV/Revised AV, NLT, etcetera) as the accurate translation of the Hebrew Second Rabbinic Bible in addition to the Byzantine texts over the ecumenical Alexandrian Minority or Critical Text family originating from the Origen school later moved to Carthage, Tunisia.

- These descriptions are not intended to be an end-all description of these prophecies' applications. They are intended to demonstrate the validity, originality and vitality of the Biblical faith in the Lord Jesus from all points of the Old Testament into the sole divinely given commentary, the New Covenant. Let this be a harbor for the contrite sinner, and a sword and shield for the Christian disciple.

Credit for the raw data in this table goes to the blog [Doing Right Christians](#), which I do not endorse, but wish to give honor where it is due. This raw data has been purged of synergistic errors as well as reformatted slightly from the original. The percentiles expressed in the chart beneath round to the nearest tenth of a percent the area of the sacred writings to which the prophecies correspond of the 39 Old Testament books or the 27 of the New Testament; these are divided into the Torah (Law or Pentateuch), Historical, Poetry, the five major prophets, twelve lesser, the Gospel records, History of the Church, and the Epistles or Letters. The last group are divided into those of Paul, 14 (for this chart I will side with the Authorized Version translators in considering Paul the author of the letter to the scattered Hebrews), The Epistles General, named after their penmen, James, Jude, the four of John including the Apocalypse (Apoc.), the two of Peter. For the purposes of this study, considered are those from the Old Testament alone to understand how much each division reveals by percentages a foretelling of the blessed Lord Jesus Christ, whose name means in the Greek language, "The Anointed Saviour", our Faithful and True. This is not by any means all the messianic prophecies, such as Joel 3.15-16 but this is an exhaustive list; therefore, from this list were these percentages determined according to each of the five sections of the "prophets and the law", Matthew 11.13. This data only pertains to the Old Testament, 59 percent of 66

canonical books, not to the remaining 40 percent of the New Testament where God pleased the prognostications respecting His Son.
