MAN WITHOUT GOD

What a wretched creature man is without God! No good thing dwells within him (Rom. 7:18) and the things of the Spirit of God are foolishness unto him (I Cor. 2:14). His heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately wicked (Jer. 17:9). He is abominable and filthy and drinks iniquity like water (Job 15:16). He loves what he ought to hate and hates what he ought to love and his rebellious mind is enmity against God. He is not subject to the law of God and neither indeed can be (See Rom. 8:7), and consequently he is incapable of pleasing God.

They could never have beheld His face in peace if Christ had not died for them and if He had never reached down His hand of mercy, lifting them up out of the dunghill of iniquity, and quickening them into divine light and life. Hell would have been their eternal doom if He had not shed abroad His love in their hearts and brought them to love His great name. They would never have known anything but contempt and hatred for Him if He had left them to their own will and way. Truly He has been merciful to His people. How blest are those who hunger and thirst after righteousness, for He gave them that hunger and thirst! "Bless the Lord, O my soul: and all that is within me, bless his holy name," etc. (Psalm 103:1-5).
