Philosophical Criteria and Cosmological Models

' "People need to be aware that there is a range of models that could explain the observations, " [South African cosmologist George F. R.] Ellis argues. "For instance, I can construct you a spherically symmetrical universe with Earth at its center, and you cannot disprove it based on observations." Ellis has published a paper on this. "You can only exclude it on philosophical grounds. In my view there is absolutely nothing wrong in that. What I want to bring into the open is the fact that we are using philosophical criteria in choosing our models. A lot of cosmology tries to hide that."

Did you see that? At least this Cosmologist is honest about it. Regarding which model of the universe they choose (Helio-centricity or Geo-Centricity) He admits that they use philosophical criteria in choosing our models.

Let me translate that for you. It means it is not based on science, but religious beliefs. (Humanism is a religion, like it or not)

He openly admits that Geo Centricity is excluded because it does not fit into their religious mold.

It takes WAY MORE faith to believe in Big Bang and evolution than it does to believe in Christianity.
